Plaintiff Konstantin Khionidi the alleged "Russian citizen" allegedly living in "Russia" pretending to be a "very wealthy Russian oligarch" is not a real person and does not exist. Per Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 17(a) "An action must be prosecuted in the name of the real party in interest." Plaintiff could not legally file the Adversary Proceeding or a reply to any appeal because they don't exist. Plaintiff must come with clean hands to each and every court. Plaintiff has never proven they exist even though Appellant raised this issue, made this argument.

Plaintiff's attorney Philip Stillman swore to the Court multiple times that the Plaintiff would prove they exist by signing a notarized document. After months of excuses stating the Plaintiff is "traveling all over the world" Plaintiff never submitted any proof of existence to the Court or signed a notarized document ever.
